Class News

<u>Nursery</u> Pupils have learned about the tradition of having a Christmas tree and enjoyed making them and decorating them. They have been learning the Christmas story and shared some lovely songs with their parents this week to celebrate Christmas.

<u>Reception</u> Just before Christmas children had a trip to Leeds Minster to learn about the Christmas story and look at all the life size nativity figures. The children also had a wonderful trip to Middleton Railway where they had a train ride with Santa Claus and were given a present each. They have made lots of Christmas angels in class.

<u>Year One</u> As part of their science topic about their bodies, children enjoyed a trip to Thackray Medical Museum. They have also taken part in some road safety training about crossing the road safely. The children had a brilliant time at Skelton Grange Environmental Centre where they made dens, had a campfire and made crafts out of natural materials.

<u>Year Two</u> As part of their topic about toys pupils had a visit and workshop at Abbey House Museum where they handled and looked at toys from the past. Guy Fawkes also visited them to teach about the Gun Powder Plot and brought lots of exciting objects to share. Children really enjoyed a visit to Harewood House for a Christmas crafts workshop earlier this week.

<u>Year Three</u> Children have recently enjoyed the story, Coming Home, and learned lots of facts about Robins as part of their Christmas topic. They have made some lovely story maps which re-tell the story.

<u>Year Four</u> An Egyptian workshop provided a real highlight for year 4 to enhance their history topic last term. The children also took part in road safety training and enjoyed a visit to Moortown Baptist Church for a workshop about Christmas where they made tea light holders and took part in a Christmas quiz.

<u>Year Five</u> Pupils enjoyed a trip to Leeds City Museum as part of their topic about the Ancient Greeks. As part of their science topic they visited the waterworks in Headingley to learn about the watercycle and the challenges of getting clean water in Ethiopia.

Pupils visited Leeds Minster to see an exhibition about local people who fought in the First World War. They produced some amazing poetry imagining how the people would have felt. Some children also took part in a dodgeball competition.











Other News

<u>Flu Vaccines</u> We were delighted that so many of our pupils took up the free vaccine across school to help them stay healthy over the winter.

<u>Fashion Club trip</u> Many thanks to Mr Guthrie and Miss Trew for organising another excellent trip to Leeds College of Art, where pupils took part in a workshop and met fashion students. <u>Parents' Evening</u> It was good to see so many parents at our recent parents' evening. I hope you found the information useful and enjoyed looking through your child's work. Many thanks to everyone who bought a book at our book sale. School Council managed to raise £100 during the sale.

<u>Choir</u> Last week the children were invited to sing carols at a Christian Aid concert at Leeds Minster, perform at the Rotary Club lunch in Headingley and share carols at an elderly people's home. They really were a pleasure to listen to and we were very proud of them all.

<u>Lateness and Absence Reporting</u> Attendance figures for this academic year so far average at 98.5%, which is very good.
