#### Class News

<u>Nursery</u> Children have been enjoying many traditional stories including The Three Pigs, Jack and the Beanstalk and Goldilocks. They have baked gingerbread men, planted beans, made models and pictures and acted out the stories. Many thanks to all the parents who are attending the Share a Story sessions in nursery at 9.00 and 12.15 each Friday.

<u>Reception</u> Pupils have been learning about polar animals and made some super pictures collages of polar bears and penguins.

<u>Year One</u> Children visited Abbey House Museum as part of their history topic. They handled lots of different equipment and learned about household objects from the past.

<u>Year Two</u> Children really enjoyed their visit to Leeds Minster where they explored all the materials within the building as part of their science topic. They are really enjoying learning about oceans, continents and capital cities of the world using atlases to help them.

<u>Year Three</u> In history the children are learning about the Stone Age and Celts leading onto Romans and are looking forward to their trip where they will be a Roman soldier for the day. They have made some super models of Stone Henge at home.

<u>Year Four</u> The children have enjoyed learning about Tudor life and the Kings and Queens in history this term. They are looking forward to their residential trip to Lineham Farm and it was good to see parents who attended the information session about the trip.

<u>Year Five</u> Children are continuing to enjoy their Victorians topic and were Victorian detectives on their trip to Kirkstall Abbey Museum. They recently led a whole class assembly about planets and space which was really interesting and pupils made some brilliant models of the solar system at home.

<u>Year Six</u> Children have been writing letters presenting two sides to an argument about graffiti and have looked at graffiti in the area. They have enjoyed having a visitor who shared information from World War Two about evacuation and morse code.









#### Other News

<u>Football</u> Once again Mr Robertson and Mr Leigh have entered into the league cup with the school football team. They will be playing matches against Colton, St Augustines and Roundhay Primary Schools next half term.
