<u>Class News</u>

<u>Nursery</u> Pupils have been having fun dressing up as superheroes and had a wonderful superheroes day where they took part in an assault course and made capes and masks. They have also been learning about dinosaurs and digging for fossils in nursery.

<u>Reception</u> Children have enjoyed the story of The Hungry Caterpillar and learned about the lifecycle of a butterfly. They have also enjoyed learning about mini-beasts.

<u>Year One</u> Children have been doing lots of writing and storytelling from the book Rosie's Walk, which they have really enjoyed. They re-created the Great Fire of London as part of their history topic to show how the houses caught fire. They have also planted vegetables in the allotment area.

<u>Year Two</u> They have been learning about what animals need to survive and have attended a survival adventure day at Skelton Grange this week. They have also been planting vegetables and learning about the parts of a plant and what they need to grow.

<u>Year Three</u> Children have been reading the book Charlotte's Web and explored the characters and plot. They visited Temple Newsam farm to learn all about the farm that features in the story. They made some great information leaflets all about spiders.

<u>Year Four</u> Children have been practising their sewing skills by making purses this term. They also enjoyed a workshop all about sounds as part of their science topic.

<u>Year Five</u> Children have been learning about Brazil and made some information leaflets. They have also attended a workshop with the Into University organisation where they learned about stereotyping. They had a visit from a nurse this week to learn about puberty and how our bodies change.

<u>Year Six</u> As part of their science about adaptations, class 6 have researched the characteristics of camels. They have summarised their learning in some excellent information texts explaining why camels have certain features to enable survival.
